Swenson earned a Master of Public Administration and a Master of Science in Forest Resources, both with focuses on environmental policy, land planning, and natural resources management, from the University of Washington. Swenson earned a Bachelor of Business Administration from the University of Wisconsin–Madison. Swenson resides in Seattle, WA.
