Who is Team Throwe?

Throwe Environmental (Throwe) serves as the Field Liaison for three National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) grant programs. In these roles, the Field Liaison team at Throwe assists prospective applicants in developing and submitting competitive grant applications for tens of millions of dollars in NFWF funding annually. The Throwe Field Liaisons advance NFWF programs by...

- Promoting NFWF programming to communities across the country
- Conducting individual outreach, hosting workshops and webinars, and presenting at conferences
- Helping applicants develop competitive grant applications through technical assistance, one-on-one support, best practices, draft proposal review, and site visits
- Providing follow-up and feedback to proposals that were not selected for funding
- Supporting existing grantees through check-ins and troubleshooting

Throwe supports the following NFWF programs:

National Coastal Resilience Fund (NCRF). Established in 2018, NCRF invests in conservation projects that restore, increase, and strengthen natural infrastructure that mitigate the impacts of storms and other coastal hazards to communities, and enhance fish and wildlife habitat. Long Island Sound Futures Fund (LISFF). Established in 2005, LISFF invests in projects to improve water quality, restore the natural environment, and engage and inform communities about the importance of the health and living resources of the Long Island Sound.
